

Focus on how you envision the moment, the actions you'll do standing in front of your guests or if you wish to have special effects to boost the general experience.

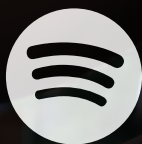
